ABSTRACT

This research thesis discusses and aims to analyze the cause, type, and effect of colonialism depicted in Gregory Allen Howard's *Harriet* movie. The analysis is based on Robin Blackburn's and Frantz Fanon's theory. Library research is used as the research method of this study where the source data is divided into primary data, gathered from the Harriet movie transcript, and secondary data from various reference books, journals, and theses. The result shows the cause, type, and effects of colonialism that are depicted in the movie. The cause is the social hierarchy where white people justify the enslavement of black people by thinking that they are lower than white people in society. The type covers exploitation as the type of colonialism practiced in the movie. The exploitation colonialism explains how white people exploit the unwilling labor from their slaves. The effects of colonialism cover physically as in slavery towards black people, psychologically as in inferiority complex in black people, and the effect which represents both physically and psychologically as in resistance by black people.
