

Analysis of Factors Affecting the Development of Village-Owned Enterprises
(BUMDes)

ABSTRACT

Village-owned enterprises or commonly referred to as BUMDes are institutions established by the village government in order to improve the village economy. The purpose of this study was to analyze the factors that influence the development of BUMDes in Barru Regency, South Sulawesi Province. This research method used is multiple linear regression through SPSS. The data used is in the form of primary data obtained through questionnaires and interviews. The total population is 40 BUMDes by using saturated sampling method or census. The variables used are youth participation, human capital, social capital, financial capital, and the role of government.

The results showed that the variables of youth participation, human capital, social capital, financial capital, and the role of government simultaneously had a significant effect on the development of BUMDes in Barru Regency. In addition, partially the role of the government has a significant positive effect on the development of BUMDes in Barru Regency, while the variables for youth participation, human capital, social capital and financial capital have no significant effect on the development of BUMDes in Barru Regency.
