INTRODUCTION

1.1 Background of the Study

Coates (2013:86) uses the example of how people grow up in the United Kingdom, where everyone is taught that women talk more than men, that women 'gossip,' that men curse more than women, that women are more courteous, and others. Language use based on gender (male and female) has become one of the interesting topics to study even from decades before. The last few years there have been several studies on differences in language and generation, whether it is just focusing on the language features or focusing on one of the female or male languages. Some studies focus on the use of language features in either women or men, such as Pamikat (2020), Purnata, et.al (2021), Nuringtyas and Navila (2022) focus on analyzing women's language features. These studies adopt Lakoff's (1975) model.

Some of the following studies such as Juwita, et.al (2018), Putra and Prayudha (2019), Ertanti (2020), Erwiarti (2021) focus on examining women and men language using Coates' (2004) with its seven features.

The object of this study is a movie titled *Mr. and Mrs. Smith* (2005) which is written by Simon Kinberg and director Doug Liman. The film captivated audiences with its two lead characters, Brad Pitt as John and Angelina Jolie as Jane, and told the story of a married couple who work in rival agencies as assassins but neither realizes it at first. This movie became the top-selling film in 3.424 theaters in the United States and Canada in first week. The difference in gender but having the same job makes this movie a fascinating object of study.

There are some studies related to the object of this study, such as Alexandra (2015) who adopted Wood (1993), Spolsky (1998) and Schmidt (2002) model to show the speech style used by Angelina Jolie as Jane in the film. Another study by Wiguna (2022) used Lakoff's (1975) model, which aims to look at the differences in language features between women and men that can influence gender differences in this movie.

However, the analysis of the film *Mr. and Mrs. Smith* (2005) concerning to the use of language between men and women using Coates' (2013) model has never been carried out. Therefore, the writer chose to analyze the film using Coates' (2013) which focuses on the two lead characters, Jane and John. The reason for choosing Jane and John is because they are the two lead characters, who is appear frequently and have the most conversations in the movie.

1.2 Research Question

In light of the background of the study, two research questions can be formulated:

- 1. What are Coates' language features used by the lead characters in *Mr. and Mrs. Smith* (2005)?
- 2. What are the purposes of using the lead characters' language features in *Mr*. and *Mrs*. *Smith* (2005)?

1.3 Objectives of the Research

In line to the aforementioned research question, this study aims to fulfill the following objectives:

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1. To identify and describe the type of language feature used by the lead

characters in the data. Additionally, the study aims to determine the most

frequently used language features in the data.

2. To reveal the purpose of the lead characters' language features in Mr. and

Mrs. Smith (2005)
