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ABSTRACT

This study aims to answer three research problems related to the character of Simon Brown in Kirk Jones's *Nanny McPhee* movie. The first objective is to explain the factors that cause Simon's rebelliousness, the second objective is to reveal the roles of Nanny McPhee in curing Simon's rebellious behavior. The third objective is to analyze the causes of Simon's personality development from the perspective of Alfred Adler's Individual Psychology.
