ABSTRACT

This research paper focused on studying the character of the Little Prince in the novel *"The Little Prince"* by Antoine De Saint-Exupery (2003 edition). The author specifically used a linguistic approach called the transitivity process to analyze the characterization of the Little Prince. To gather data, the author observed the character's actions and documented them using non-participant observation methods. The actions were categorized into six types based on the transitivity process. The data were then manually annotated from the narrator's perspective and the character's speech when the character actively participated and the data were put into the table showing each process frequencies. The findings revealed the Little Prince as a curious, kind-hearted, persistent, responsible, and brave child. The most frequently used process in portraying the character's actions was the verbal process, indicated by the frequent use of words like "asked" and "said." The behavioral process, characterized by the lexicon "responsible" and "let go," described the main character's sense of responsibility. The material process was also employed to depict the character's care for his planet and bravery as he shows his courage to travel the world alone with lexicon "traveled" and "cleaning". The frequent use of words in the mental process reflected the main character's understanding and fellowship toward others, shown in lexicon "glad" and "sad", while the relational process highlighted the character's persistence in his thinking with lexicon "had ideas". In brief, Little Prince is seen as someone who is active with his traits of curiosity, kindness, persistence, responsibility, and bravery.
