ABSTRACT

Transitivity processes in describing trauma in Colleen Hoover's novel *It Ends with Us* (2016) explores the important social issue of domestic violence and its impact on survivors such as the protagonist Lily Bloom. Lily endured traumatic experiences of witnessing and experiencing abuse that shaped her perspective, emotions, and behavior. Her complex character and the theme of domestic violence make the novel a compelling choice for transitivity analysis, which could yield meaningful findings about trauma representation. The purpose of this qualitative study is to identify the types of transitivity processes used to describe Lily Bloom's attitudes toward her trauma. Document analysis was conducted to collect the data from utterances describing Lily's trauma reaction. The data were thematically analyzed. The results indicate Lily's emotional, cognitive, behavioral, physical, and social reactions to her trauma were mostly negative. She reacted with a variety of emotions that showed trauma had a serious psychological effect, including anger, fear, guilt, and denial. The transitivity analysis of her thoughts, feelings, and behaviors reveals the trauma's continuous effect.
