ABSTRACT

Along with the issuance of Law no. 6 of 2014 concerning Villages, then began an era in which the village has been recognized by the state in its position as a legal community unit that has the authority to manage its own government affairs, so it is mandatory for the village to carry out its functions, one of which is to promote general welfare for the community. The village to carry out its duties certainly requires resources sourced from central government transfers. In fact, the revenue from the government transfer still does not meet the needs for infrastructure development. Therefore the village creates another source of funding, namely Village Original Income (PADes). There are several types of PADes sources that can help villages as additional income. Of the various types of PADes in the village, Village-Owned Enterprises (BUMDes) are one of the PADes that can absorb labor and help improve the economy of the community and village because the management is fully managed by the community. The purpose of this study was to analyze the role before and after the existence of BUMDes on the welfare of the people in Sambiyan Village.

This study uses mixed methods, namely using quantitative and qualitative methods. The population of this study is the people of Sambiyan Village who feel the impact of BUMDes as many as 100 people, while 80 people are taking the sample using the slovin formula.

The results showed that BUMDes in Sambiyan Village had a positive impact on the community and there were significant differences between before and after BUMDes in Sambiyan Village.
