#### **ABSTRACT**

Oppression is a social problem that occurs in society and can happen anywhere, even in developed countries. This oppression issue has been the problem from time to time and people who recognize the injustice have been fighting and trying to stop the oppression. The purpose of this writing is to analyze the oppressions experienced by women characters and their resistance act in opposing oppressions depicted in *Moxie* (2021). In examining the oppressions and resistance depicted in *Moxie*, five faces of oppressions theory by Young and resistance theory will be used.
