## **CONCLUSION**

Because this study focuses on the mental disorder suffered by Adam, the analysis is divided into two parts: intrinsic and extrinsic aspects. Intrinsic aspects consist of characters and conflicts. The character analyzed in this research is Adam, the main character in the movie. Adam's hobby is cooking, and the goal is to become a great chef. Conflict analysis in this study is divided into internal and external conflicts. The internal conflict that occurs is between Adam and the three people inside him, which is the effect of the mental disorder. The external conflict occurred between Adam and Paul. Paul is his mother's lover, who suddenly lives in the same house with them. Adam did not like Paul's arrival from the start because it was considered disturbing and not on his side.

The extrinsic element of this study focuses on the mental disorder that Adam has suffered as the main character in this movie. The writer found that Adam is under pressure on himself after his father abandoned them. Adam feels everything that happens in his life is his fault. That is why Adam feels depressed

and unable to talk to anyone, and thus becomes a mental disorder. Using Cherry's theory to analyze the symptoms of schizophrenia, there are two symptoms: positive and negative. Adam's positive symptoms are delusions and hallucinations, while his negative symptoms are uncontrollable and easily provoked. Adam's delusions and hallucinations are to hear strange noises and see the three people who are always following him

Then, the writer finds the results by using the Kraepelin theory about the type of schizophrenia experienced by Adam, and it considers that there are three types of schizophrenia: schizophrenia simplex, schizophrenia hebephrenic, and schizophrenia paranoid. Adam's symptoms affect his life. Once those closest to Adam know of his mental disorder, they withdraw from him.
