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ABSTRACT

Amidst the multifaceted responsibilities of motherhood, the pressure to embody the "good mother" often leads to internal conflicts and guilt felt by mothers. The Lost Daughter (2021), directed and re-written by Maggie Gyllenhaal, tackles the deep complications of motherhood, utilizes the contrasting journeys of the main characters, Leda and Nina, to portray the prevalent struggles of mothers grappling with societal expectations, personal desires, and maternal guilt. The aims of this study is to analyze and give further explanation regarding motherhood struggles and maternal guilt that occurred in the object of the study, The Lost Daughter. This study uses Simone de Beauvoir feminist literary criticism since it exposes women's representation as mothers. Library research and descriptive-qualitative is also used in analyzing the movie. The results of this study highlights how Leda and Nina are fueled by overwhelming responsibilities and a lack of the partners' support. Their internal struggles, including feelings of failure and self-doubt, ultimately pushes them towards self-reflection and reconciliation, which depict relentlessly seeking to navigate the complexities of motherhood and allay the burden of guilt that can manifest in both emotional and physical distress.
