ABSTRACT

Women have developed unique characteristics in their communication. These characteristics have influenced the usage of language. So, this study analyses the features of women's language and the politeness strategy in the novel The Queen's Gambit. This study is to find out the main character's politeness and to discover the comparison in strategies used by her toward male and female characters. In collecting the data, this study applies primary and secondary research, which are documentation and internal data. In analyzing the data, this study applies descriptive qualitative methods. according to Lakoff's theory, the finding of this study is that men and women characters in the novel have different results in using the features of women's language, which leads to the conclusion that women characters are more polite than men, besides, Beth Harmon's utterances are included within the women characters utterances. Based on the theory of face-based politeness by Brown and Levinson, the highest Beth Harmon's politeness strategy is a positive strategy. The sub-strategy she used frequently toward male characters is to avoid disagreement, and toward female characters is to seek agreement.
